



Revisions

Julie Merriman is an artist who draws, which might make her seem like a member of an increasingly uncommon group. More significantly perhaps, she's an artist who places drawing at the heart of her output. Here, she has produced a visually gorgeous show of works on paper and canvas using typewriter carbon film, wax pencil and acrylic. They range from abstract to near-architectural-looking images on a detailed, schema level. Each composition, no matter how disjointed, is held together by the solidity of her line. Intelligent mark-making is her forte. This show is part of the Dublin City Public Art

Programme and the result of Dublin-based Merriman's year-long focus on drawing as a core element of the work of architects and engineers in Dublin city council departments. Merriman makes visible the fault lines that occur when presumed permanence meets the inevitability of change. She magnifies that moment in her work, underlining our assumptions, ambitions and insecurities about the built environment and our attempts as human beings to shape and control it.
